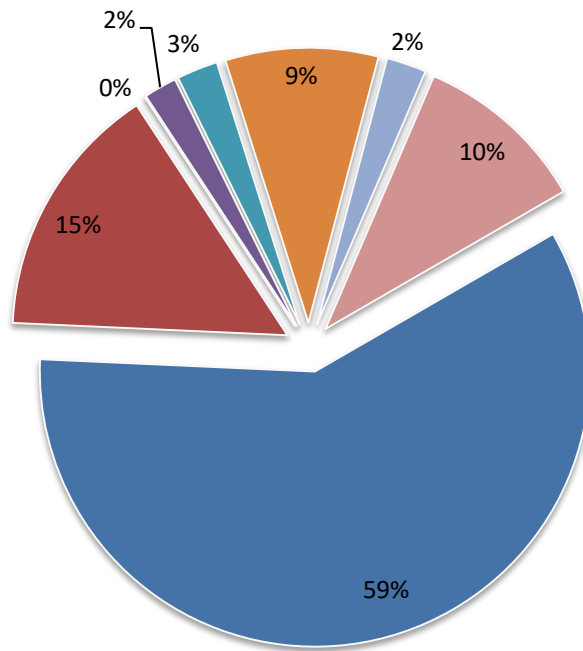

Transition

For Early Head Start transition we do the following:

The Early Head Start teachers meet with the Head Start teachers. Head Start teacher has been meeting with the Early Head Start teachers twice a year for transition meetings. Parents are invited to attend transition meetings. Home-base parents and children also have this opportunity. The Early Head Start teachers keep a list of transition activities for each child. The transition activities may include such things as potty training, IFSP/IEPs, self-help skills, etc. Early Head Start center and home-based parents and children are given the opportunity to visit the preschool classrooms. Last year for example they were told they could visit any Thursday or Friday in April.
