

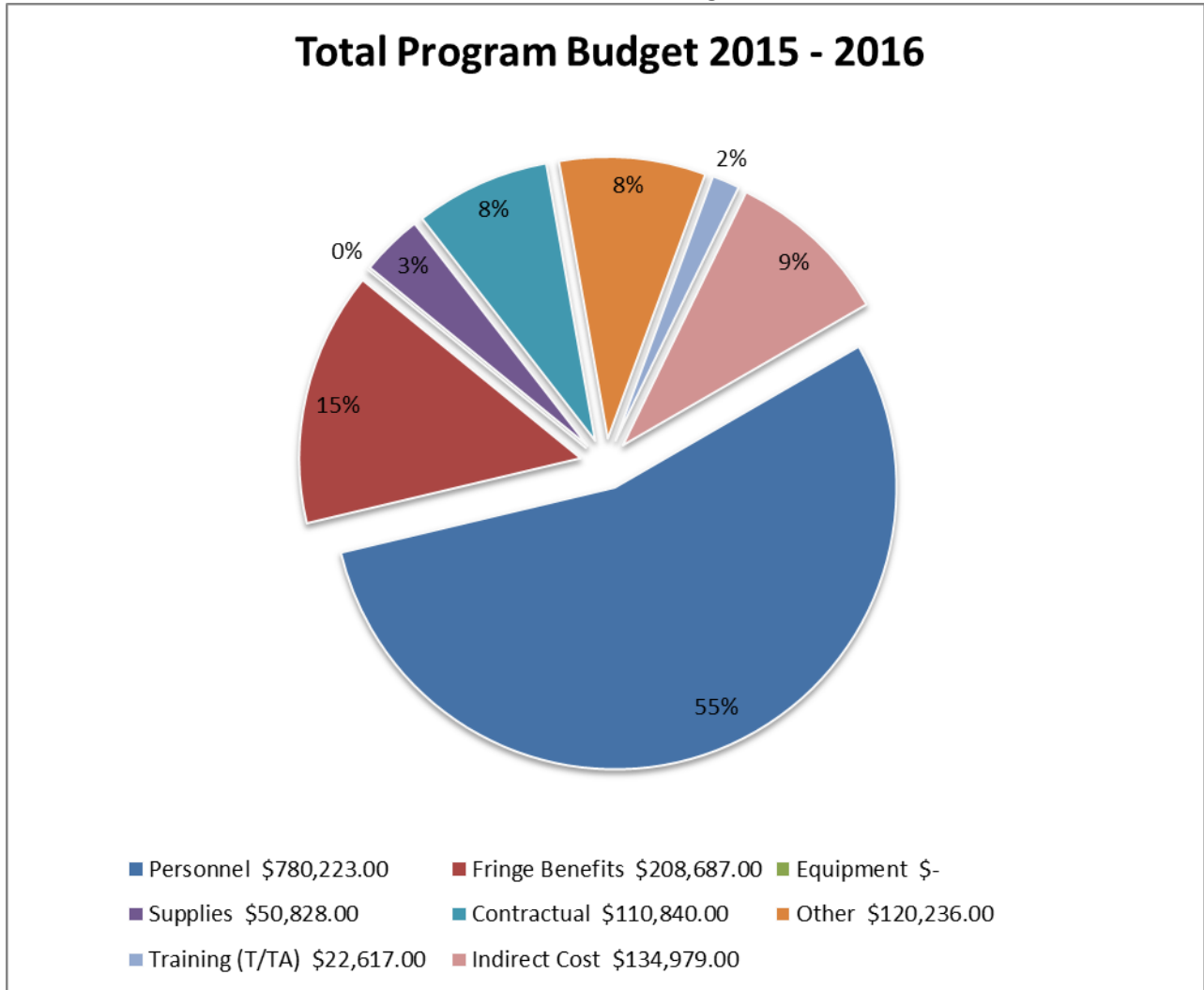

**Transitions**

Each year the policy council reviews and approves a written transition plan. The plan requires that a "child's transition" form be completed to record the transition readiness activities to be carried out prior to the end of the school year. Specific behaviors and skills needed in kindergarten (carrying food trays,

opening milk cartons, taking turns, waiting, etc.) are noted and individualized. A similar activity facilitates the transition from Early Head Start to Head Start.

Each school district in the service area signs a transition agreement in which they agree that twice a year Head Start preschool and kindergarten teachers, parents and appropriate agency representatives will meet to discuss specific needs of specific children to preview what transitioning Head Start children will be capable of at the beginning of kindergarten. Head Start children visit kindergarten classrooms they will be attending. Some of the kindergarten teachers are able to come to head start for get acquainted visits.
